Electrical safety

- All installation and operation should conform to your local electrical safety codes.

Environment

- Do not aim the device at strong light to focus, such as lamp light and sun light; otherwise it might cause over brightness or light marks, which are not the device malfunction, and affect the longevity of Complementary Metal-Oxide Semiconductor (CMOS).
- Do not place the device in a damp or dusty environment, extremely hot or cold temperatures, or the locations with strong electromagnetic radiation or unstable lighting.
- Keep the device away from any liquid to avoid damage to the internal components.
- Keep the indoor device away from rain or damp to avoid fire or lightning.
- Keep sound ventilation to avoid heat accumulation.
- Transport, use and store the device within the range of allowed humidity and temperature.
- Heavy stress, violent vibration or water splash are not allowed during transportation, storage and installation.
- Pack the device with standard factory packaging or the equivalent material when transporting the device.
- Install the device in the location where only the professional staff with relevant knowledge of safety guards and warnings can access. The accidental injury might happen to the non-professionals who enter the installation area when the device is operating normally.

Operation and Daily Maintenance

- Do not touch the heat dissipation component of the device to avoid scald.
- Carefully follow the instructions in the manual when performing any disassembly operation about the device; otherwise, it might cause water leakage or poor image quality due to unprofessional disassemble. Please contact after-sale service for desiccant replacement if there is condensed fog found on the lens after unpacking or when the desiccant turns green. (Not all models are included with the desiccant).

- It is recommended to use the device together with lightning arrester to improve lightning protection effect.
- It is recommended connect the grounding hole to the ground to enhance the reliability of the device.
- Do not touch the image sensor (CMOS) directly. Dust and dirt could be removed with air blower, or you can wipe the lens gently with soft cloth that moistened with alcohol.
- Device body can be cleaned with soft dry cloth, which can also be used to remove stubborn stains when moistened with mild detergent. To avoid possible damage on device body coating which could cause performance decrease, do not use volatile solvent such as alcohol, benzene, diluent and so on to clean the device body, nor can strong, abrasive detergent be used.
- Dome cover is an optical component, do not touch or wipe the cover with your hands directly during installation or operation. For removing dust, grease or fingerprints, wipe gently with moisten oil-free cotton with diethyl or moisten soft cloth. You can also air blower to remove dust.

- Please strengthen the protection of network, device data and personal information by adopting measures which include but not limited to using strong password, modifying password regularly, upgrading firmware to the latest version, and isolating computer network. For some device with old firmware versions, the ONVIF password will not be modified automatically along with the modification of the system password, and you need to upgrade the firmware or manually update the ONVIF password.
- Use standard components or accessories provided by manufacturer and make sure the device is installed and maintained by professional engineers.

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Introduction


This product is a type of integrated camera which consists of panoramic camera and tracking PTZ dome camera. It provides monitoring effect of both panoramic and details. Panoramic camera can provide real-time HD surveillance of 180°/225°/270°/315°/360° view coverage. Besides, it is convenient to recognize and exclude abnormity via quick positioning and zoom in of tracking PTZ dome camera when abnormity happens.

2 Cables

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- Cable type might vary with different devices, and the actual product shall prevail.
- Waterproof all the cable joints with insulating tape and waterproof tape to avoid short circuit and water damage. For the detailed operation, see the *FAQ Manual*.

Figure 2-1 Cable list





3 Network Configuration

Device initialization and IP setting can be finished with the "ConfigTool" or in web interface. For more information, see the *Web Operation Manual*.

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- Device initialization is available on select models, and it is required at first use and after device is being reset.
- Device initialization is available only when the IP addresses of the device (192.168.1.108 by default) and the PC stays in the same network segment.
- Planning useable network segment properly to connect the device to the network.
- The following figures and interfaces are for reference only, and the actual product shall prevail.

3.1 Initializing Device

<u>Step 1</u> Double-click "ConfigTool.exe" to open the tool.

Step 1 Click Search setting.

The **Setting** interface is displayed.

<u>Step 2</u> Enter the start IP and end IP of the network segment in which you want to search devices, and then click **OK**.

All the devices found in the network segment are listed.

<u>Step 3</u> Select one or several devices which **Status** are **Uninitialized**, and then click **Initialize**. The **Device initialization** interface is displayed.

Step 4 Select the devices that need initialization, and then click Initialize.

The password setting interface is displayed. See Figure 3-2.

<u>Step 5</u> Set and confirm the password of the devices, and then enter a valid email address. Click **Next**.

The final setting interface is displayed.

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Password can be modified or reset in System Settings.

- Step 6
 Select the options according to your needs and then click **OK**.

 The Initialization interface is displayed after initializing is completed. Click the success icon (✓) or the failure icon (▲) for the details.
- Step 7 Click Finish.

The device status in the Modify IP interface (Figure 3-1) turns to Initialized.

3.2 Modifying Device IP Address

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- You can modify IP address of one or multiple devices in one time. This section is based on modifying IP addresses in batch.
- Modifying IP addresses in batch is available only when the corresponding devices have the same login password.
- <u>Step 1</u> Do Step 1 to Step 4 in "3.1 Initializing Device" to search devices in your network segment.

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After clicking **Search setting**, please make sure the **username** and **password** are the same as what you set during initialization, otherwise there will be "wrong password" notice.

<u>Step 2</u> Select the devices which IP addresses need to be modified, and then click **Modify IP**. The **Modify IP Address** interface is displayed. See Figure 3-3.

<u>Step 3</u> Select **Static** mode and enter start IP, subnet mask and gateway.

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- IP addresses of multiple devices will be set to the same if you select Same IP.
- If DHCP server is available in the network, devices will automatically obtain IP addresses from DHCP server when you select **DHCP**.

Step 4 Click OK.


3.3 Logging in Web Interface

<u>Step 1</u> Open IE browser, enter the IP address of the device in the address bar and press Enter.

If the setup wizard is displayed, follow the instructions to finish the settings.

- <u>Step 2</u> Enter user name and password in the login box, and then click Login.
- <u>Step 3</u> For first time login, click **Click Here to Download Plugin** and install the plugin as instructed.

Enable smart track, and then configure the tracking parameters. And when any anomaly is detected, the speed dome would track the target until it gets out of the surveillance range.

Precondition

You already configured heat map, intrusion, or tripwire on the panoramic camera.

4.1 Enabling Alarm Track

Alarm track is disabled by default; and you need to enable it manually.

<u>Step 1</u> Select Setting > Event > Smart Track > Alarm Track.

The device is equipped with calibration parameter by default, and you can modify them manually as needed.

Step 1 Select Setting > Event > Smart Track > Smart Track.

You need at least 4 pairs of calibration boxes to ensure the views of the speed dome and the panoramic camera as similar as possible.




- The tool required for the installation such as electric drill is not provided in the packing.





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
- Pull the power plug off before installing or removing the SD card.
- Press and hold the RESET button for 10 s to reset the camera.










Make sure the mounting surface is strong enough to hold at least three times of the device weight.





















5.3.4 Installing Waterproof Connector (Optional)
